What is Power of Ten?

The Power of Ten Program offers ten early-career veterinarians the opportunity to complete a personal and professional development program comprised of in-person educational opportunities and activities over a 12-month period.

The PVMA will provide topic experts, meals, and meeting expenses at no charge to the participant. Current membership in the PVMA is required. Modules will be held primarily at the PVMA office located in SW Portland with the exception of attendance at the AVMA's Veterinary Leadership Conference in Chicago.

- Develop fundamental understanding of leadership skills, personal and professional goal setting, and emotional intelligence
- Deepen understanding of communication styles and skills
- Heighten awareness of yourself and better understand how to maximize interactions with those around you

- Experience a supportive environment that fosters meaningful interpersonal relationships and collaborative, lifelong interactions

Program eligibility: PVMA member veterinarians who have graduated from an accredited college of veterinary medicine between approximately 2013-2020. Others will be considered on a case-by-case basis. It is recommended that 2021 graduates wait until they complete their intern year but will still be considered if someone is particularly interested.

To Apply: Completed applications will be accepted through <u>Friday, August 20th</u> and participants will be determined by September 1st.

2021-22 Curriculum

There will be 7-8 in-person modules (5-7 hours each), along with an 2-night kick-off retreat, several informal gatherings with other PVMA members and P10 alumni. Modules will primarily be on Thursdays from 2-7pm and the format will vary by module. Most will be held at the PVMA office located in SW Portland.
